Who and What We Are

The purpose of the Clare County Office of Emergency Management is to protect the communities by coordinating and integrating all activities necessary to mitigate against, prepare for, respond to, and recover from threatened or actual natural disasters, acts of terrorism, or other manmade disasters. The Emergency Management Office assesses local capabilities to respond to emergency and disaster situations and advocate emergency preparedness in both the public and private sectors.

Responsibilities

- Ensure that hazards that threaten Clare County are clearly identified.
- Improve upon the local emergency response related skills of local personnel.
- Conduct exercises to test training and validate plans.
- Increase public awareness of hazards and appropriate mitigation actions.
- Identify and implement vulnerability and risk reduction measures.
- Conducts regular Local Emergency Planning Commission (LEPC) meetings.
- Assist residents and government and private sector organizations.

Emergency Preparedness Kit Checklist

Water, food, and clean air are important things to have in the event of an emergency. Each emergency preparedness kit should be customized to meet your specific needs, such as medications and infant formula. It should also be customized to include important documents for you and your family.

Basic Kit - Recommended Supplies:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert, and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- □ First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- □ Infant formula and diapers, if you have an infant
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Dust mask or cotton t-shirt to help filter the air
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- □ Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)

Clothing and Bedding:

Living in a cold weather climate, you must think about warmth. It is possible that the power will be out and you will not have heat. Rethink your clothing and bedding supplies to account for growing children and other family changes. One complete change of warm clothing and shoes per person, including:

- Jacket or coat
- □ Long pants
- Long sleeve shirt
- □ Sturdy shoes
- Hat and gloves
- □ Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person

Additional Items:

Listed below are other items for your family to consider adding to your kit. Some of these items can be dangerous, so please handle carefully. Other emergency reference materials can be found at www.ready.gov.

- □ Light Stick
- □ Emergency Candle
- Multi Tool
- □ Rain gear
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, and plastic utensils
- □ Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Paper towels
- □ Fire Extinguisher
- Tent
- □ Compass
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Signal Flare*
- □ Paper, pencil

- Pet supplies and documents
- Personal hygiene items including feminine supplies
- Disinfectant*
- Household chlorine bleach* You can use bleach as a disinfectant (diluted nine parts water to one part bleach), or in an emergency you can also use it to treat water. Use 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe, or bleaches with added cleaners.
- □ Medicine dropper
- Important Family Documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof, portable container
